#### 4th of July

Ken Drellishak suggested that for each of the 3 supporting city groups, we deliver a \$100.00 check to a specific foundation or charity on their behalf.

#### **CERT**

All 800+ homes in Peninsula Point are now mapped

Each block has a block captain - 30 blocked captains

Block captains asked to help recruit backup captains.

Block captains received their "Go-Bags"

Debbie Collins suggests we consider purchasing walkie-talkies for the 30 block captains, approx \$750.00.

# Bay Beach Storage Shed will contain the following:

- Basic First Aid supplies
- Defibrillator (The defibrillator came with DVD instructions)
- Search and rescue tools

Everything will be in plastic bins, labeled.

Locked and to be used only in major emergencies, not for beachgoers, etc.

The shed will not stock food or water.

# **Recurring Costs:**

Defibrillator pads must be replaced every 2 years, 4 years to replace its battery Certain First Aid supplies have time limits and must be replaced.

Note: The defibrillator was paid for by The Foundation.

### **CERT** funding:

CERT is a separate community organization, supported by local residents.

BPPA supports CERT by providing information and events on our website, in the Pointer, etc., and we have voted to pay for specific one-time needs. Note that the BPPA is not responsible for recurring costs.

When members purchase a BPPA brick, a portion of that money will go to CERT.

CERT will bring in additional revenue by selling emergency to residents.

On the BPPA membership form, CERT is also listed on a separate line for those who want to support it. \$1,315.00 has already been collected.

- Motion passed; \$1,700.00 will be added to the \$1300 already raised from membership money for CERT to help pay for storage shed needs.

#### Pointer

# Residential Care Facility

Terry Andrus provided the board with backdrop of the current state.

He restated that the BPPA has attended meetings of concerned neighbors of a proposed new care facility and that the larger community has similar concerns.
